Founded in Canada by curator Dario Duran, Duran Art Projects develops curatorial initiatives that connect Iranian contemporary art with international audiences. Its activities span exhibitions, publishing, curatorial research, advisory work, educational programming, and philanthropic initiatives developed in collaboration with artists, institutions, galleries, and cultural organizations.

CURATORIAL APPROACH

Duran Art Projects approaches curatorial practice as a form of cultural dialogue, emphasizing research, historical context, and interdisciplinary inquiry. Its projects explore questions of memory, identity, power, cultural continuity, and the role of art within broader social and historical contexts. Working across commercial, nonprofit, and institutional environments, the organization develops initiatives that seek to create meaningful and lasting connections between artists and international audiences.
